
Global Arms Industry to Augment Profits After North Korea Bomb Test - Advocacy Group

WASHINGTON, January 8 (Sputnik) - The worldwide firearms market will be able to increase its profits following the alleged test of a North Korean hydrogen bomb, US advocacy group Helping Hands Korea Catacombs Founder and Director Tim Peters told Sputnik. "The arms industry will huddle to see how this new crisis can increase profits," Smith said on Thursday. Earlier on Wednesday, Pyongyang claimed it had carried out the first test of a hydrogen bomb. Several states, especially neighboring South Korea and Japan, have subsequently called for new sanctions against the country. Peters argued this myth of a hydrogen bomb is just one more lie North Korean Supreme Leader Kim Jong-Un has told. "Kim Jong-Un is a congenital liar, as were his father and grandfather," Peters said. "My guess is there's a 90% chance the North Korean scientists didn't develop it themselves." Peters said that worse than a nuclear bomb, there are still more than 20 million North Koreans having their human rights violated by being held in slavery. "The likelihood that a North Korean missile will land in L.A. is 0.000001%," Peters concluded. "The likelihood that scores of malnourished children and labor camp prisoners will die today is 100%." On Wednesday, Columbia University Korean Studies in the Social Sciences Professor Charles Armstrong told Sputnik that the North Korean bomb test could lead to a global nuclear arms race.
